1.	Ensure a Sign-In, Sign-Out Attendance log is available for and signed by parents/guardians.			
2	There are no more than four (4) children present in the home,			
۷.	including children related to the Day Care Home Provider.			
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٥.	There must be a working telephone in the home at all times which			
	may include cell phones in the home. 911 phones are not			
1	acceptable.  Parent/guardian information must be accessible in case of			
4.				
	emergency. Emergency numbers must be placed near the phone or readily available.			
5.	There must be at least 2 (two) useable and unblocked exits from			
	the home. One exit may include a breakable, non-barred window			
	on the ground floor. (No minimum height is required for that exit			
	window.)			
6.	Children must not be kept in a room that is without a window.			
7.	Children must not be kept in a second story apartment without a			
	second exit door to the ground.			
8.	There must be at least one working smoke detector on each floor			
	of the home (each smoke detector must be tested during each			
	visit.)			
9.	All toxic substances such as medicines, cleaning agents, polishes,			
	bleach, detergents, paints, insecticides, etc. must be stored out of			
	children's reach and away from food.			
10	Kerosene or other portable heaters must not be in use while			
	children are present unless there is a guard around the device			
	which makes the heater inaccessible to touch by the child/ren.			
11	Unused electrical outlets accessible to children should be			
	covered. Electrical cords on equipment shall be inaccessible to			
	children. Bottle warmers must also be secured and inaccessible to			
	children.			
12	There must be a safety gate for all open stairwells when children			
	under age five (5) are in the home.			
13	Floors, walls, ceilings, doors, windows must be clean and in good			
	repair.			
14	All weapons must be stored unloaded and locked away from the			
	children.			
15	Lighting, heating and ventilation must be adequate for normal			
	activities.			
16	Power tools or other dangerous tools must be secured or			

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otherwise inaccessible to the children.		
17. Fixtures and window blinds shall be clean, operative and properly		
adjusted with all pulls and cords inaccessible to children.		
18. The home must have a working indoor toilet available to the		
children and Day Care Home Provider, as well as a diapering area		
with appropriate supplies and is sanitized after each use. Children		
must not be left unattended.		
19. Both hot and cold running water, soap and towels must be		
available for hand washing.		
20. Children's toys, play materials, tables and chairs, etc., must be		
clean, in good repair and meet safety standards.		
21. Have a written policy for the care of sick children. Must have on		
file parent/guardian's permission to administer all medication		
including dosage. Have any special medicines for the children,		
labeled with child's name. All medications, prescription and non-		
prescription must be inaccessible to children.		
22. Verification of current immunization status and recent physical		
examination for each child unless a verifiable exclusion is on file.		
23. Follows prevention and control of infectious disease practices.		
24. Have a first aid kit available and appropriately stocked.		
25. Records of children with special needs should be on hand which		
specify conditions & doctor's instructions for care.		
26. Smoking must not be allowed when children are present. Smoking		
is not allowed on the premises when children are present.		
27. If transportation is provided by or on behalf of the Day Care Home		
Provider, the driver of the vehicle must have current auto		
insurance, a current and valid driver's license kept on his/her		
person whenever transporting children and submit to a		
background check.		
28. If transportation is provided, the Day Care Home Provider ensures		
that age appropriate and federally approved child safety restraints		
are always used and the Day Care Home Provider has a clear		
procedure to ensure that no child is ever left unattended in a		
vehicle.		
29. Food preparation areas should be separate from the eating,		
playing, toilet, bathroom and diaper-changing areas.		
30. Eating area must have age appropriate furniture with proper use		
of manufacturer's high chair restraints, age appropriate tables and		
chairs, and/or boosters if at a regular dining table.		
31. Drinking facilities must be clean, accessible. Each child must have		
their own cup.		
32. Ensure garbage is in proper containers and inaccessible to		
children. Nonabsorbent Containers should be covered, clean and		
be disposed frequently. Use proper handling and storage of		
hazardous materials and ensure the appropriate disposal of bio		
contaminants.		
33. The home is free of insects and rodents and there should be no		
evidence of their presence.		
34. Ensure that screen windows and doors in the home are in good		
repairs and all self-closing doors function appropriately.		
35. Adult supervision is present in all outdoor activity.		
36. Outdoor play areas are clean, safe and free of hazards, including		

vehicular traffic.					
37. Swimming pool areas must be inaccessible to children when	n not				
in use. Wading pools are drained when not in use. Adult					
supervision is required at all times.					
38. If children are allowed to swim, adult supervision is required	and				
the Day Care Home Provider and or supervising individual m					
have First Aid and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) tra					
and be in attendance during the time the child/children are in

39. Day Care Home Provider follows safe sleep practices. Each	ahild				
should have his/her separate sleeping space such as but no					
limited to, age appropriate cots, cribs, 2" kinder mats, etc. the
